

Jobs will Increase in IT Hardware Production, 27 Applications Approved for PLI

India is now one of the largest IT capitals of the world. All the major IT players of the world have a presence in India. Because of the growth in electronic manufacturing in India and the success of the Production Linked Incentive Scheme (PLI) for mobile phones, the government had approved PLI Scheme-2.0 for IT hardware in May 2023. The plan covers laptops, tablets, allin-one PCs, servers and ultra small form factor devices. The government has approved the applications of 27 IT hardware manufacturers. With the commencement of IT hardware manufacturing by renowned companies in India, about 2 lakh employment opportunities including 50 thousand direct ones will be created. IT hardware worth about Rs 3.50 lakh crore will be produced for which companies will invest about Rs 3,000 crore. Union Minister for Railways, Communications and Electronics and IT Ashwini Vaishnaw has said that out of these 27 applicants, 23 are ready to start manufacturing immediately.

Southeast Asia's first Night Sky Sanctuary in Ladakh

Southeast Asia's first Night Sky Sanctuary will soon start in Ladakh, the country's youngest union territory and an old civilization. It is being established in collaboration with the Indian Institute of Astrophysics, Bangalore. Union Minister of State Dr. Jitendra Singh has informed that on behalf of the Ministry of Science and Technology and the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, we will request Prime Minister Narendra Modi to inaugurate the Night Sky Reserve located in Hanle, Ladakh. The minister said the dark sky reserve. being one of 15 or 16 of its kind in the world, would attract those interested in astronomy. The Dark Sky Reserve will be located in Hanle village in eastern Ladakh as a part of the Changthang Wildlife Sanctuary. It will boost astro-tourism in India and will be one of the top locations in the world for optical, infra-red and gamma-ray telescopes. It is spread over 1,073 square kilometers. Adjacent to the Indian Astronomical Observatory, the world's second highest optical telescope of the Indian Institute of Astrophysics is located at Hanle at an altitude of 4500 metres.

Krishi Sakhi to promote natural farming

In rural India, the role of Natural Farming Initiative will be very critical in turning the dream of the Prime Minister of making villages 'Samriddhi Gaon' and self-help group members becoming Lakhpati. In this backdrop, the government wants to increase natural farming at a faster pace by assigning the role of Krishi Sakhi to the women of Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihood Mission (DAY-NRML). For this, the Ministry of Rural Development and the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare will jointly train Krishi Sakhis. The government is moving ahead with the target of training and certifying 50,000 Krishi Sakhis in a phased manner. The Ministry of Agriculture and Welfare will take their services in various schemes. The training module has been prepared and sent to the National Institute of Agricultural Extension Management (MANAGE) for final review. The scheme will help small and marginal farmers to increase their productivity.



Mixing Compressed biogas in CNG-PNG

Mandatory blending of Compressed Bio-Gas (CBG) with CNG and PNG in City Gas Distribution (CGD) areas will start. This information has been shared by Union Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas and Housing and Urban Affairs Hardeep Singh Puri. Blending will be voluntary in the financial year 2024-25 while mandatory blending obligation will be applicable from 2025-26. There will be mandatory blending of 1% in the initial year, then 3% in 2026-27, 4% in 2027-28 and 5% in 2028-29. CBG Blending Obligation (CBO) will promote the production and consumption of CBG in the country. The National Biofuels Coordination Committee, chaired by Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri, has announced mandatory blending of CBG in CNG (transport) and PNG (domestic) on November 24. It aims to increase demand for CBG, save foreign exchange, promote a circular economy and help in achieving the goal of net zero emissions.



India becomes chair of International Sugar Organization (ISO)

The International Sugar Organization (ISO) has announced to make India the chair of ISO for the year 2024 in its 63rd Council Meeting. Leading the global sugar sector is a major achievement for the country which reflects the country's growing stature in the region. India, during its Chairmanship, wants to focus on bringing together member countries to adopt more sustainable practices in sugarcane cultivation, sugar and ethanol production and better utilization of by-products. India is the largest consumer and second largest producer of sugar in the world. In the sugar market, Brazil is the leader in the Western Hemisphere and India is the leader in the Eastern Hemisphere.



Education of the future generation will play an important role in achieving the vision of a developed India. To prepare rural children for the future, it is necessary to educate children according to future needs in the 21st century. This is why PM SHRI Schools (PM School for Rising India) are being expanded to provide comprehensive and inclusive education to students with the standards set in the full spirit of the National Education Policy 2020. On November 17, Union Minister of Education and Skill Development and Entrepreneurship Dharmendra Pradhan inaugurated 37 PM SHRI Kendriya Vidyalayas and 26 PM SHRI Navodaya Vidyalayas in Odisha. Under the scheme the PM SHRI Schools (PM Schools for Rising India) has to be set up by strengthening more than 14,500 existing schools managed by the Central Government, State Government, Union Territory or local body was announced by PM Narendra Modi in September, 2022. In the first phase, 6207 schools from 27 states and union territories have been selected.



Current Events: Uttarkashi Tunnel Rescue Operation

A NEW LEASE OF LIFE

The 41 workers who spent 17 days stuck in Uttarkashi's Silkyara Tunnel embodied, passion, vigour, and courage beyond words. It was the perseverance of the workers trapped in the tunnel that was giving strength to all the agencies in the country. They worked around the clock to save the workers. Not only the country, but also the entire world, was watching this shocking incident. The Uttarakhand government, many ministries of the central government, agencies, and experts from home and abroad collaborated to make this campaign a success.

n November 12, a part of the Silkyara tunnel in Uttarkashi, Uttarakhand, caved in during construction. As a result, 41 workers working inside the tunnel lost contact with the outside world. As the news reached the centre through the Uttarakhand government, on the directions of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, all concerned agencies were directed to safely evacuate the workers trapped in the tunnel. Even though the distance between the workers and the outside world was 60 metres, the heartbeat in bridging this distance was increasing with time. There was lots of fear. It seemed that the thread of life would be broken, but the hard work of the country's agencies, the prayers of crores of countrymen, and the direction of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to adopt a whole-government approach for this entire operation were very beneficial. As a result, all 41 workers trapped in the tunnel were safely evacuated on the night of November 28 after a long struggle of 17 days with the technical help taken from home and abroad.

After the workers were safely pulled out of the tunnel, Prime Minister Narendra Modi described the success of this entire rescue operation as an emotional moment for everyone. PM Modi saluted the spirit of all those associated with the Uttarkashi tunnel rescue operation and said that the success of the rescue operation is making everyone emotional. He appreciated the courage and fortitude of the workers who came out safely after 17 days and wished them good health. Everyone involved in the mission set a wonderful example of humanity and teamwork. The

PM Modi told the workers that 'if something bad had happened, it is difficult to say how we would have handled it. 16-17 days is not a short period; it is important you kept each other's spirits high. I was aware of the situation but worried about it... Do you want to say anything'?

The workers stated, Sir, I was in the tunnel for 17–18 days and not once did I feel weak. There was no panic; everyone lived as brothers; everyone ate food; and everyone ate together. The area where they were trapped in the tunnel was about two and a half kilometres long, and it was where they used to walk after dinner. There was no work to be done other than eating and drinking, so we did yoga and morning walks. We are grateful to the Central Government, the Uttarakhand Government, and all the agencies that put in a lot of work round the clock.

Talking to worker, Gabbar Singh Negi, PM Modi said, "I especially thank you. The Chief Minister told me that you showed both leadership and team spirit".

"I think maybe some universities will have to prepare a case study about Gabbar Singh Negi, the person of the village, and what leadership qualities are there in him who handled the entire team even in times of crisis". Then Gabbar Singh said that all of you encouraged, did not leave any kind of deficiency, worked hard day and night, and kept moving. "Sir, if you rescue Indians stranded in other countries and bring them back to the country, we are at home. After this, Akhilesh, a resident of Mirzapur in Uttar Pradesh, and Sonu Kumar, a resident of Chhapra in Bihar, also shared their experiences with Prime Minister Modi and said, 'Sir, there was no problem in these 17 days. Mobile chargers and mobile phones were also sent inside by the agencies. When we were bored, we would talk to our family members and our mood would become lighter'.

PM Modi says that '140 crore countrymen were worried; even the common citizen used to ask when the workers trapped in the tunnel would come out. Family members also exercised restraint and cooperated'. PM Modi said that during a G-20 meeting, world leaders also expressed concern over this incident, but the courage you have shown will provide further lessons. PM Modi said that he has told the Chief Minister of Uttarakhand that if workers want to go home, arrangements will be made as per your team's wishes. Prime Minister Modi told the workers that if he ever gets a chance to meet them, he will definitely remember them.

Effective leadership and teamwork lead to happy results

- At 5:30 am on November 12, 2023, the underconstruction tunnel connecting Silkyara and Barkot collapsed as a result of rubble falling 60 meters in the direction of Silkyara.
- 41 workmen were trapped when the mud collapsed in at a distance of 205 to 260 meters from the Silkyara portal as they were performing reprofiling work within the tunnel, 260 to 265 meters from the portal. The state and federal governments dispatched immediate resources to save the 41 workers who were stuck.
- As soon as the news of the incident was received, Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister, Dr. PK Mishra, informed Prime Minister Narendra Modi about the incident and the rescue operation launched. It was also informed that the Deputy Secretary in the PMO, Mangesh Ghildiyal, has been rushed to the spot. The PMO official remained there till the operation was successful.
- Bhaskar Khulbe, a former advisor to Prime Minister Modi, was also directed to visit the site of the incident on the request of the PMO for regular monitoring of the situation.
- Under the direction of the PMO, experts associated with civil and tunnel engineering, as well as new technologies, including drones, robots, and endoscopic cameras, were deployed to make the operation a success..
- It was decided to lay a 900-mm pipe through the debris as it was the best and fastest possible

solution, as per the advice of experts.

- Work on several other options was undertaken simultaneously. The tunnel was built at the place where the workers were trapped. Its length was two kilometers, and its height was 8.5 meters.
- The five options and five agencies—Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC), Satluj Jal Vidyut Nigam Limited (SJVNL), Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL), National Highways Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited (NHIDCL), and Tehri Hydro Development Corporation Limited (THDCL)—were assigned specific tasks. These five agencies worked in tandem with timely work adjustments for operational efficiency.
- When a metal object came in front of the auger drilling a pipe to reach the workers, work on another option began immediately. The Border Roads Organization (BRO) built the 1150-meter link road, which was afterwards handed over to Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL). BRO also delivered the drilling machine to the location.
- As part of the Char Dham highway project, a 4.531-km-long bi-directional, two-lane tunnel is being constructed at Silkyara to connect Gangotri and Yamunotri bases.
- On completion of the tunnel, pilgrims will have all-weather connectivity. Instead of traveling about 26 km, the 4.5 km distance will take just 5 minutes instead of the current 50 minutes.
- State and central agencies worked for more than



400 hours to make the campaign a success. The safety of 41 workers trapped inside, as well as those working outside, was taken care of.

- There is hardly any department of the government that has not been involved in this campaign. Green corridors were provided at some places to transport the necessary equipment to the spot.
- The Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), aviation sector, railways, BRO, ONGC, Ministry of Health, Telecommunications, State Government, SDRF of Uttarakhand, local administration, National Highways Authority of India, and DRDO were all involved in the rescue operation.
- Tremendous work was done at the top leadership level to coordinate all the departments and bring the scattered things together in this campaign.
- Multiple options for the rescue operation were worked out simultaneously. The other options were not closed, and work on them was also continued.
- Hospital beds were prepared in advance to take care of the stranded people after evacuation so that all the evacuated workers could be monitored under the supervision of doctors for 48 to 72 hours.



Arnold Dix, an Australian micro-tunneling expert, was invited by the Indian government to join the rescue operation as a consultant. After which he spent many days and nights outside the tunnel with the rescue workers.



restraint and courage shown by the family members of the workers in this challenging time are exemplary. After the safe return of the workers, Prime Minister Modi spoke to them and directed the Uttarakhand government to arrange for their return home so that they do not face any problems in reaching their families.

Prime Minister Modi wanted to speak with the workers immediately, but he directed that first the medical examination of all the workers be done, and then he would talk to them. After the medical examination of the trapped workers, the Prime Minister was informed that all the workers are medically fit and there is no problem. After this, Prime Minister Modi could not stop himself: he said that he could not wait for tomorrow because there was a lot of enthusiasm. Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke to the workers who came out of the tunnel late in the night.

Despite his hectic schedule, Prime Minister Modi sought every detail of the incident from Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami and PMO officials. The seriousness of the situation can be gauged by the fact that Prime Minister's Principal Secretary P.K. Mishra personally arrived at the site to speak with the trapped workers and meet the people working there. On the PMO's instructions, necessary arrangements were made immediately so that the agencies involved in relief and rescue do not face any difficulties in their work and there is no shortage of resources. Regular contact was maintained with the workers to keep their morale up.

Chandrayaan-3

July 14, 2023, will always be inscribed in golden letters in India's space sector. Chandrayaan-3, which flew on July 14, set foot on the south pole of Moon on August 23, where no country had been able to reach. The place where the lander landed was named 'Shiv Shakti' Point, and the spot where Chandrayaan-2 left its mark was named Tiranga.

Surya Mission Aditya L-1

The country's first Sun mission, Aditya L-1, was successfully launched on September 2. Aditya L-1 will travel a distance of about 15 lakh kilometres from Earth through the PSLV-C57 rocket. It will take about 125 days, i.e., about 4 months, to reach Sun-Earth's Lagrange Point-1.

Gaganyaan

The Gaganyaan test rocket for human space flight took a successful step towards success on October 21. The first Crew Escape System Test Vehicle test of Mission Gaganyaan has been successful. A total of 20 tests, including three uncrewed ones, are to be conducted on this mission.

Asia's largest helicopter factory

Asia's largest helicopter factory, Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) in Tumakuru, Karnataka, is dedicated to the nation. This will make India self-reliant in helicopter design, development, and manufacturing.

Spread over 625 acres this factory will have the facility to manufacture more than 1,000 helicopters in the 3 to 15-tonne category in the future



uccessfully completed a sortie on the Tejas. The experience was incredibly enriching, significantly bolstering my confidence in our country's indigenous capabilities, and leaving me with a renewed sense of pride and optimism about our national potential," Prime Minister Modi posted on X.

Tejas, a two-seater state-of-the-art fighter aircraft, has been designed with contemporary concepts and technologies such as quaduplex digital fly-by-wire flight control system, advanced glass cockpit, integrated digital avionics system and advanced composite materials for the airframe.

Indigenous fighter aircraft Tejas Nation

This fighter aircraft has given a further boost to the country's defence capabilities and preparedness.

IAF test crew have been involved with the Tejas project right from conceptual stage until prototype testing. The first version of the aircraft was inducted into the IAF in 2016. Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) currently has the capacity to manufacture 8 LCA aircraft per year. This is being extended to 16 aircraft per year until 2025, and then an additional production line is being set up that will produce up to 24 aircraft per year on commissioning. In the coming years, Tejas will be the largest fleet of fighter aircraft operated by the Indian Air Force.

Prime Minister Modi visited HAL's units and appreciated its growing capabilities and production facilities. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said India's defence manufacturing is growing at a rapid pace under the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

The Prime Minister took stock of the production facilities for LCA Tejas aircraft in Bengaluru. On this occasion, he was briefed about the technologyrelated work being done in HAL towards realising the vision of 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat." Prime Minister Modi inspected the production line of LCA Tejas and interacted with engineers on various features of the aircraft.

Prime Minister Modi was informed that HAL is striving to take the level of indigenous content in aircraft beyond 70 percent and take India towards self-reliance in defence and aerospace in the next 3–4 years under the indigenization drive as part of the Atmanirbhar Bharat vision. PM Modi was also

shown various indigenous helicopters, like the Light Combat Helicopter (LCH) Prachanda, the Advanced Light Helicopter (WSI Rudra), and the Light Utility Helicopter.

HAL briefed PM Modi about the combat and demonstration capabilities of Prachanda, with an emphasis on high-altitude deployments in Leh, Ladakh, and the Eastern Himalayan regions. The helicopter can fly up to an altitude of six kilometres. The defence forces need 156 additional Prachanda helicopters to augment the nation's defence preparedness and efforts towards self-reliance.

Free ration scheme extended, women SHGs to get drones

The welfare of the country's poor has always been a top priority for Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government. On the ground, this government has fulfilled the mantra of welfare of the poor. The Union Cabinet approved to extend the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana for another five years. This demonstrates the Union Government's dedication and commitment to improving food and nutritional security in the country. Apart from this, several other proposals have been approved, including the provision of drones to women's self-help groups.



DECISION: The Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana to be extended for the next five years, starting January 1, 2024. Identified poor families across the country will continue to get five kg of food grains every month. IMPACT: With this decision of the government, about 81.35 crore beneficiaries of the country will continue to get free food grains. About Rs 11.80 lakh crore will be spent on food subsidies in the next 5 years.

DECISION: The Cabinet approved the plan to provide drones to women's self-help groups. Drones will be made available to 15000 women from self-help groups chosen under the scheme. **IMPACT:** This will greatly benefit women in self-help groups as well as farmers in the country. Their income will rise, and they will experience new levels of happiness. A self-help group member will be required to complete five days of drone pilot training. The member will receive ten days of training in the use of agricultural nutrients and pesticides.

IMPACT: This decision will help end sexual and gender-based violence. The scheme aims to provide justice within a stipulated period in cases of rape and sexual exploitation of minor girls. The centre's share will be funded from the Nirbhaya Fund.

DECISION: The Cabinet approved the Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM Janman) to improve the socio-economic conditions of particularly vulnerable tribal groups. **IMPACT:** This mission will provide basic facilities like roads. connectivity, and sustainable livelihood opportunities to the habitations of vulnerable tribal groups. Besides, it will not only provide basic facilities like housing, drinking water, education, and health but will also make their lives more comfortable and safe. DECISION: The Union Cabinet approved the Terms of Reference for the Sixteenth Finance Commission.

IMPACT: The terms of reference for the Sixteenth Finance Commission will be notified in due course. The Sixteenth Finance Commission will submit its report by October 31, 2025, and its recommendations will be implemented for the next five years. The Fifteenth Finance Commission was constituted on November 27, 2017, and its recommendations are valid until the financial year 2025–26.■

G-20 TO WORK TOGETHER ON AI, deepfakes, and terrorism

India chaired the G20 for a year in which it held more than 200 meetings in more than 60 locations to make the G20 the People's G20. The 18th G20 Summit, held in New Delhi on September 9–10, unanimously adopted the G20 Leaders' Declaration. At the initiative of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, a virtual summit of G-20 leaders was held on November 22 to follow up on these announcements and reiterate the pledges. This is the second time in two-and-a-half months that PM Modi has hosted world leaders. This is a testimony to India's growing strength and leadership capability at the global level.

ndia took over the G20 Presidency Ceremonial Gavel on November 16, 2022. In the year since then, along with the members. India has moved ahead on the resolve to make the G20 inclusive, ambitious, action-oriented, and decisive and has taken it to new heights. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had proposed the virtual summit to review the status of expeditious implementation of the announcements that were unanimously adopted at the G-20 Leaders' Summit in New Delhi. The virtual summit was held on November 22, wherein important outcomes and action points of the New Delhi Summit were discussed. Leaders of all G-20 member countries, including the President of the African Union, nine quest countries, and 11 heads of international organisations, were invited to the conference.

This virtual summit provided another opportunity for global leaders to meet amid the many ongoing crises in the world. Such meetings are invaluable in resolving geopolitical challenges. This was the first time that G-20 leaders met twice in a year. The activities done so far were reviewed, with development being the main agenda. India stands united in the fight against terrorism.

India is emerging as the voice of the Global South. The African Union, which has 54 countries, was unanimously admitted to the G-20. Their issue was also raised at the virtual summit. This strengthens India's position. A call for human-centric development was made. To implement the DPI in the countries of the Global South, a proposal to establish a Social Impact Fund and an initial contribution of \$25 million were announced. It was anticipated that the rest of the G-20 countries would also join this initiative.

Addressing the virtual summit, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that in the era of artificial intelligence, there is a need to use technology in a responsible manner. There is a growing concern about the negative use of AI all over the world. India's clear thinking is that "we should work together on global regulation of AI. We have to move forward by understanding the seriousness of deep fakes. We want AI to reach people, and it should be safe. With this approach, the Global AI Partnership Summit will be held in India next month, and I am confident that all of you will cooperate in this as well." The discussions during the virtual conference covered the priorities of the Global South, the fight between Israel and Hamas, as well as the issue of terrorism. The G-20 members appeared to agree on key issues

In today's world, full of mistrust and challenges, it is mutual trust that binds us and connects us to each other. This year, we have expressed faith in "One Earth, One Family, One Future." Moving away from controversies, unity and cooperation have been shown. I can never forget the moment when all of us in Delhi unanimously welcomed the African Union to the G-20. The message of inclusivity given to the entire world is unprecedented.

These themes include G20 to G21, Data for Development, Implementing the Goa Roadmap for Tourism, Digital Public Infrastructure, Accelerating Progress on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Inclusive Trade for Prosperity, Indian Development Model, Nari Shakti: Towards Women-led Development, Multilateral Development, Reforming Banks, Climate Finance, and Green Growth. The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development Goals has only seven years left. With this in mind, the New Delhi G20 Leaders' Declaration encourages accelerating progress and outcomes on the 17 SDGs at the subnational, national, and international levels.

TOWARDS A BRIGHTER FUTURE: INDIA'S G20 PRESIDENCY AND THE BEGINNING OF A NEW MULTILATERALISM

India completed 365 days as G-20 Chair on November 30. The G-20 grouping, which is considered the world's economic forum, has now become a truly people-centric G-20 under India's chairmanship, and the summit's New Delhi Declaration has become an important milestone. During its presidency, India introduced the world to Indianness and transformed it into a massive festival of public participation, with over 200 events in over 50 cities. Here is a special article by Prime Minister Narendra Modi outlining how India, as the G-20 President, has shown the world a new human-centered path.


oday marks 365 days since India assumed the G20 presidency. It is a moment to reflect, recommit, and rejuvenate the spirit of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" (one earth, one family, one future). As we undertook this responsibility last year, the global landscape grappled with multifaceted challenges—recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, looming climate threats, financial instability, and debt distress in developing nations—all amid declining multilateralism. In the midst of conflicts and competition, development cooperation suffered, impeding progress.

Assuming the G20 Chair, India sought to offer the world an alternative to the status quo, a shift from GDP-centric to humancentric progress. India aimed to remind the world of what unites us, rather than what divides us. Finally, the global conversation had to evolve. The interests of the few had to give way to the aspirations of the many. This required a fundamental reform of multilateralism, as we knew it.

Inclusive, ambitious, actionoriented, and decisive—these four words define our approach as G20 president, and the New Delhi Leaders' Declaration (NDLD), unanimously adopted by all G20 members, is testimony to our commitment to deliver on these principles. Inclusivity has been at the heart of our presidency. The inclusion of the African Union (AU) as a permanent member of the G20 integrated 55 African nations into the forum, expanding it to encompass 80% of the global population. This proactive stance has fostered a more comprehensive dialogue on global challenges and opportunities.

The first-of-its-kind "Voice of the Global South Summit," convened by India in two editions, heralded a new dawn of multilateralism. India mainstreamed the Global South's concerns in international discourse and has ushered in an era where developing countries take their rightful place in shaping the global narrative. Inclusivity also infused India's domestic approach to the G20, making it a people's presidency that befits the world's largest democracy. Through "Jan Bhagidari (people's participation) events, the G20 reached 1.4 billion citizens, involving all states and Union Territories (UTs) as partners. On substantive elements, India ensured that international attention was directed to broader developmental aims, aligning with the G20's mandate.

At the critical midpoint of the 2030 Agenda, India delivered the G20 2023 Action Plan to Accelerate Progress on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), taking a cross-cutting, action-oriented approach to interconnected issues, including health, education, gender equality, and environmental



sustainability. A key area driving this progress is robust digital public infrastructure (DPI). Here, India was decisive in its recommendations, having witnessed the revolutionary impact of digital innovations like Aadhaar, UPI, and Digilocker firsthand. Through the G20, we completed the Digital Public Infrastructure Repository, a significant stride in global technological collaboration. This repository, featuring over 50 DPIs from 16 countries, will help the Global South build, adopt, and scale DPIs to unlock the power of inclusive growth.

For our One Earth. we introduced ambitious and inclusive aims to create urgent, lasting, and equitable change. The Declaration's "Green Development Act" addresses the challenges of choosing between combating hunger and protecting the planet by outlining a comprehensive roadmap where employment and ecosystems are complimentary, consumption is climate-conscious, and production is planet-friendly. In tandem, the G20 Declaration calls for an ambitious tripling of global renewable energy capacity by 2030. Coupled with the establishment of the Global Biofuels Alliance and a concerted push for green hydrogen, the G20's ambition to build a cleaner, greener world is undeniable. This has always been India's ethos, and through Lifestyle for Environment (LiFE), the world can benefit from our age-old sustainable traditions.

Further, the Declaration underscores our commitment

to climate justice and equity, urging substantial financial and technological support from the Global North. For the first time, there was a recognition of the quantum jump needed in the magnitude of development financing, moving from billions to trillions of dollars. The G20 acknowledged that developing countries require \$5.9 trillion to

fulfil their Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) by 2030. Given the monumental resources required, the G20 emphasised the importance of better, larger, and more effective multilateral development banks. Concurrently, India is taking a leading role in UN reforms, especially in the restructuring of principal organs like the UN Security Council, that will ensure a more equitable global order.

Gender equality took centre

stage in the Declaration, culminating in the formation of a dedicated Working Group on the Empowerment of Women next year. India's Women's Reservation Bill 2023, reserving one-third of India's Parliament and state legislative assembly seats for women, epitomises our commitment to women-led development.

The New Delhi Declaration embodies a renewed spirit of collaboration across these key priorities, focusing on policy coherence, reliable trade, and ambitious climate action. It is a matter of pride that during our presidency, the G20 achieved 87 outcomes and adopted 18 documents, a marked rise from the past.

During our G20 presidency, India led deliberations on geopolitical issues and their impact on economic growth and development. Terrorism and the senseless killing of civilians are unacceptable, and we must address them with a policy of zero tolerance. We must embody humanitarianism over hostility and reiterate that this is not an era of war.

I am delighted that during our Presidency, India achieved the extraordinary: it revitalised multilateralism, amplified the voice of the Global South, championed development, and fought for the empowerment of women everywhere.





Showing concern about the poor and middle class it has been ensured that depositors will definitely get back up to Rs 5 lakh when the bank comes into trouble. government. Redressal of public grievances was given highest priority in all the ministries. Pending files are disposed of by running a special campaign every year in October. By optimistically entering the era of good governance, the new India is fulfilling its promise of providing liberal and accountable governance.

PARAM VIR ALBERT EKKA: 1971 WAR HERO

BORN: 27 DECEMBER 1942 | DIED: 3 DECEMBER 1971

Lance Naik Albert Ekka's bravery helped him defeat the enemy army in the 1971 India-Pakistan war. Despite the fact that he was in danger of being killed, Ekka continued to strive for victory. He attained martyrdom on the battlefield while fighting with unwavering courage. His bravery helped India win the Battle of Gangasagar. Ekka was posthumously awarded the Param Vir Chakra. His sacrifice for the sake of the motherland continues to inspire his countrymen even today.

uring the 1971 Indo-Pakistan war, an Indian soldier stationed at Gangasagar noticed that his company was suffering heavy losses due to enemy machine gun fire. It was the evening of

December 3, 1971. Without caring for his own safety, the jawan stormed the enemy bunker and silenced the light machine gun by bayoneting two enemy soldiers. Suddenly, a medium-machine gun started firing from a building. Despite his injuries, he crawled forward and killed an enemy soldier with a grenade. Even though the light machine gun was still firing, the jawan showed incredible bravery by breaking into the bunker and killing the enemy.

In this way, he foiled the enemy army's attack and attained martyrdom while ensuring his victory for his side. This young martyr was none other than Lance Naik Albert Ekka, who was posthumously awarded the Param Vir Chakra for his outstanding bravery, determination, and bravery of the highest order. This medal was important because, for the first time, a soldier from Bihar (now Jharkhand) and the Brigade of Guards received it. It was also the first Param Vir Chakra to be awarded to a jawan posted in the eastern sector.

Albert Ekka was born on December 27, 1942, into a tribal family in Zari village of Gumla district in undivided state of Bihar. His father's name was Julius Ekka, and his mother's name was Mariam Ekka. Being of a courageous nature, he cherished the dream of joining the Indian Army. On his 20th birthday, his dream came true when he joined the army and joined the Bihar Regiment. Later, when the 14 Guards was formed, Albert and some of his comrades were transferred there. Albert was a skilled warrior as well as a skilled hockey player. His skill of hunting with bow and arrow in the forest proved beneficial to the army. He used to aim his gun accurately.

The 1971 India-Pakistan war will be remembered for a long time. Despite the fact that the war was fought between India and Pakistan, it resulted in the formation of a new country, Bangladesh. Many soldiers sacrificed their lives to give freedom to Bangladesh. One of those soldiers was Albert Ekka. When the war began in 1971, the Indian Army was fighting on both the eastern and western fronts. The Indian squads had to make their way to their main target in Bangladesh. The Battle of Gangasagar was crucial in this regard. Lance Naik Albert Ekka's contribution to the Indian Army's victory in this war was unprecedented.

ON THE COUNTRY'S 50TH REPUBLIC DAY IN 2000, THE GOVERNMENT OF INDIA ISSUED A POSTAGE STAMP IN HIS MEMORY. ALBERT EKKA BLOCK WAS ALSO NAMED AFTER HIM IN HIS HOME DISTRICT OF GUMLA.

Albert's daring attacks saved his comrades' lives and helped in achieving of the goal. The enemy was forced to abandon 'Akhaura' after their defeat at Gangasagar. Soon, the Indian troops were on their way to 'Dhaka' on their victory march. This 29-year-old young soldier sacrificed his life for the country with full dedication.

On December 3, 1978, the Army Postal Service issued a special postal cover to honour Albert Ekka. A major roundabout in Ranchi has been named after Albert Ekka, and a massive statue of him has been erected there. On the country's 50th Republic Day in 2000, the Government of India issued a postage stamp in his honour. Albert Ekka Block has been named after him in his home district of Gumla.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had remembered Albert Ekka on Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas on November 15 this year in Khunti, Jharkhand. He had said that every corner of Jharkhand is associated with such great personalities, their courage, and their relentless efforts. Figures like Tilka Manjhi, Sidhu Kanhu, Chand Bhairav, Phulo Jhano, Nilambar, Pitambar, Jatra Tana Bhagat, and Albert Ekka have enhanced the glory of this land.

On January 23, 2023, Prime Minister Narendra Modi named 21 islands in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands after Param Vir Chakra awardees. One of these islands is also named after Albert Ekka. "Just as the sea connects different islands, the spirit of 'Ek Bharat, Shreshtha Bharat' unites every child of Mother India," PM Modi said. All 21 Param Vir Chakra awardees had one resolve: nation first, India first. Their resolve has now been immortalised forever in the name of these islands.

75 Creative Minds of Tomorrow

The 75 Creative Minds of Tomorrow initiative was launched to help young people excel in the field of filmmaking and become tomorrow's leading filmmakers and artists. It began two years ago, in 2021. It is expected that this will provide limitless opportunities for emerging talent to shape their careers. Around 600 people applied for the positions, and 75 were chosen. These 75 young filmmakers and artists came from a variety of backgrounds and locations, including Bishnupur in Manipur, Jagatsinghpur in Odisha, and Sadarpur in Madhya Pradesh.

The participants came from India's 19 states and union territories. A selection jury and a grand jury panel of distinguished individuals chose them. All 75 participants were under the age of 35.
